With the adoption of the 2021 General Government Operating and Capital Budget, the City projected that it would collect \$11,157,000 in sales tax revenue during 2021. The table below was prepared for the purpose of reporting the actual results for 2021 and comparing them with the budgetary projections for 2021 and the actual results from 2020.

For the month of March 2021, the City collected \$183,827. Collections to date are \$176,126 more than projected for 2021. The City also collected \$95,022 more than collections in March 2020. The year-to-date collections are slightly higher than year-to-date 2020 collections by \$68,450 or 3.41%.

The table below summarizes a ten-year history of City sales tax collections. Please note that the increase in 2014 was due to the City raising its sales tax rate from 3.5% to 4%. Had the City not raised its sale tax rate, sales tax collections for 2014 would have been about \$340,000 less than 2013.
