In adopting the 2022 General Government Operating and Capital Budget, the City Council appropriated \$140,000 to the Tourism & Economic Development – Married Man's Trail Gap capital account and \$250,000 to the Tourism & Economic Development – Married Man's Trail Improvement capital account for a total project funding of \$390,000.

As indicated in the attached memorandum from Finance Director Michelle Johansen, with the approval of the City Council the Finance Department intends to combine the above mentioned 2022 capital accounts into one 2022 Married Man's Trail Improvements capital account. I concur with the Finance Director's recommendation.

These transfers merely combine the two projects into one for efficiency in design, contract administration and construction costs.

In adopting the 2022 General Government Operating and Capital Budget, the City Council appropriated \$140,000 to the Tourism & Economic Development – Married Man's Trail Gap capital account and \$250,000 to the Tourism & Economic Development – Married Man's Trail Improvement capital account for a total project funding of \$390,000. As indicated in the attached memorandum from Assistant Public Works Director Kara Jurczak, the City has advertised for and received sealed bids for Contract No. 22-13, Married Man's Trail Improvements. Three bids were received and publicly opened on Friday, May 27, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. in the City Clerk's Office. The Assistant Public Works Director's report contains a summary of the bids received.

BAM LLC submitted the apparent low bid in the amount of \$327,890. Ms. Jurczak is recommending a ten percent contingency in the amount of \$32,789, bringing the total project cost to \$360,679. As detailed in Ms. Jurczak's report, the contract and contingency will be funded through the 2022 Married Man's Trail Improvements capital accounts.

A Notice of Intent to Award was issued on May 27, 2022. As of the date of this report, no appeals have been received.

Public Works Director Mark Hilson will be attending the City Council meeting of June 16, 2022 in order to address any questions that Councilmembers may have.

A motion has been prepared for City Council consideration.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the motion accepting the bid of BAM LLC in the amount of \$327,890 for Contract No. 22-13, 2022 Married Man's Trail Improvements, establishing a ten percent contingency in the amount of \$32,789, bringing the total project cost to \$360,679; authorizing funding in the amount of \$360,679 from the 2022 Tourism & Economic Development – Married Man's Trail Gap and Married Man's Trail Improvements capital accounts; and directing the Acting City Manager to execute the contract documents on behalf of the City Council.

SUBJECT: Contract No. 22-13 – Married Man's Trail Improvements

In adopting the 2022 General Government Budget, the City Council appropriated CPV funds in the amount of \$250,000 to widen the boardwalk at Married Man's Trail Exit near Park Avenue and \$140,000 to continue the boardwalk surfacing in the Married Man's Trail Gap area. Total funding for the project is \$390,000.

During the design phase, Engineering Staff decided to combine the two projects into one for efficiency in design, contract administration, and construction costs. The combined project is called Married Man's Trail Improvements. Design was performed by Public Works Engineering. Bid documents for the project were publicly advertised on April 30, 2022. Sealed bids were opened on May 27, 2022 at 10:00 am, by the City Clerk in the City Clerk's Office. Three (3) complete bids were received, opened and read aloud as listed below:

Notice of Intent to Award for Contract 22-13 was issued on Friday May 27, 2022 to all bidders.

The Public Works Department recommends award of Contract 22-13, Married Man's Trail Improvements to BAM LLC in the amount of \$327,890. Further recommended is a ten percent contingency of \$32,789 for a total project cost of \$360,679. The contract and contingency will be funded through the Married Man's Trail Improvements CIP account.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt a motion combining the two separate CIPs, Married Man's Trail Exit and Married Man's Trail Gap, into a single CIP called Married Man's Trail Improvements, awarding Contract No. 22-13, Married Man's Trail Improvements to BAM LLC in

the amount of \$327,890; authorizing funding and use of a contingency of \$32,789 for a total project cost of \$360,679; and directing the Acting City Manager to execute the contract on its behalf.

Recommended Motion: I move that the City Council combine the two individual CIPs, Married Man's Trail Exit and Married Man's Trail Gap, into a single CIP called Married Man's Trail Improvements, authorizing budget transfers in the amount of \$140,000 from the Married Man's Trail Gap and \$250,000 from the Married Man's Trail Exit Improvements Projects to the combined Married Man's Trail Improvements Project; award Contract No. 22-13, Married Man's Trail Improvements to BAM LLC in the amount of \$327,890; authorize funding and use of a contingency of \$32,789 for a total project cost of \$360,679; and direct the Acting City Manager to execute the contract on its behalf.

To better accommodate the increasing number of tourists visiting Ketchikan per day, emphasis must be given to creating destinations outside of the downtown core to disperse the large volumes of visitors. Married Man's Trail is an important asset to aid in this effort. The existing trail narrows into a bottle neck for the last 80 feet as it traverses above the salmon ladder. The final 30 feet of trail is the narrowest part, exacerbated by tight turns and resident access issues as people try to come and go to Park Avenue. This project is intended to allow improved pedestrian flow through the trail and eliminate the crux of the blockage at its intersection with Park Avenue. The project would widen the narrow length of boardwalk and provide a viewing platform and open connection to Park Avenue and the Salmon Walk. The platform could incorporate a see-through floor element
