Stephen Reeve is a specialist in urban design, historic preservation and tourism development. He has forty years of professional experience in historic preservation, environmental policy, heritage tourism development, and community-based economic development. He has led urban development and non-profit management strengthening programs in developing countries, directed state and local government planning agencies, and carried out dozens of urban planning and design, historic preservation, tourism development, and local government management projects in the US and developing countries.
