RE: Ordinance No. 20-1905 – Amending 5.4.230(e) Of The Ketchikan Municipal Code; Increasing Taxicab Fares; And Establishing An Effective Date

The attached ordinance was prepared by the City Attorney at the request of Sourdough-Ingersoll Inc. and Ketchikan Yellow Taxi Inc., which asked that it be placed before the City Council for consideration at its meeting of March 5, 2020. If adopted, Ordinance No. 20-1905 increases taxicab rates as requested in the attached correspondence from Zac Boles and John T. Flora. Mr. Boles and Mr. Flora's correspondence is self-explanatory and requires little elaboration on the part of my office. The City Clerk's Office has confirmed that taxicab fares were last adjusted in 2005. Finance Director Bob Newell has updated the current taxicab rates using the CPI-U, US City Average from December 2005 to December 2019, which have been entered by hand on Mr. Boles and Mr. Flora's letter.

In the event the City Council wishes to consider an adjustment of the existing rates, a motion has been prepared accordingly.

Motion: I move the City Council approve in first reading Ordinance No. 20-1905 Amending 5.4.230(e) of the Ketchikan Municipal Code; increasing taxicab fares; and establishing an effective date.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-1905

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETCHIKAN, ALASKA; AMENDING 5.4.230(e) OF THE KETCHIKAN MUNICIPAL CODE; INCREASING TAXICAB FARES; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KETCHIKAN, ALASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: <u>Amendment</u>. Subsection 5.40.230(e) of the Ketchikan Municipal Code, entitled "Rates," is hereby amended to read as follows:

" (e) Rates. The rates of fare to be charged by taxicabs operating over the streets of the city are fixed as follows:

(1) [\$3.50] **§4.50** on flag drop, which amount shall include the first $1/10^{\text{th}}$ of a mile.

(2) [\$0.30] **§0.40** for each additional $1/10^{\text{th}}$ of a mile.

(3) \$1.20 for each minute of waiting time or fraction thereof.

(4) Delivery of personal property within the city limits without passenger: [\$12.00] **\$15.00**.

(5) Charter hire: [\$70.00] **\$100.00** per hour prorated for fractions of an hour after the first hour of charter service."

Section 2: **Effective Date**. This ordinance is effective one (1) month after its final passage and publication.

<u>Procurement of Residential Water Meters – Tlingit Haida</u> <u>Regional Housing Authority's Fairview Avenue Housing</u> <u>Project – Deferred from October 6, 2005</u>

The action before the Council was:

<u>Moved by Lybrand</u>, seconded by Lew Williams the City Council authorize the general manager to issue a purchase order for the procurement of water meters in an amount not to exceed \$3,400 for installation at the Tlingit Haida Regional Housing Authority's Fairview Avenue Housing Project and approve funding from the Water Division's 2005 Materials and Services account (Account No. 89).

<u>Moved by Lybrand</u>, seconded by Coyne to increase the amount not to exceed \$16,000 for the purchase of up to one hundred meters.

In response to Councilmember Jason Harris, Public Works Director Hansen said \$3,400 would purchase approximately 21 meters.

Motion to amend failed with Coyne voting yea; Kj Harris, West, Jason Harris, Norton and Williams voting nay; Freeman absent.

Motion passed with Jason Harris, Coyne, Norton, Williams, Kj Harris and West voting yea; Freeman absent.

<u>Appointments to Boards and Commissions – Mayor</u> <u>Weinstein</u>

Mayor Weinstein submitted the names of Martin Pihl and Mickey Robbins as reappointments to the Port and Harbors Advisory Board. He asked if there were any objections, and none were heard.

<u>Award of Contract No. 05-26 – Berth I Ground</u> <u>Transportation Area Improvements – Bicknell, Inc. –</u> <u>\$279,450</u>

<u>Moved by Williams</u>, seconded by West the City Council accept the bid of Bicknell, Inc. in the amount of \$279,450 for Contract No. 05-26, Berth I Ground Transportation Area Improvements; establish a ten percent (10%) contingency in the amount of \$27,945, bringing the total project cost to \$307,395; authorize funding in the amount of \$307,395 from the Phase I Port Improvements capital project account; and direct the city manager to execute the contract documents on behalf of the City Council.
